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Students to Provide Tax Filing Assistance

FORT WORTH, Texas – Come tax season, many people are happy to pay a fee to someone who will prepare their tax return for them, but for those individuals who cannot afford to outsource the task, the thought of tackling that pile of paperwork alone can be mind-boggling.

Fortunately, there are services available to help, and for the second year in a row, Texas Wesleyan University School of Law is partnering with the Community Tax Center at Foundation Communities to provide low-income families and individuals professional help with their tax returns.

Sixteen students recently attended a day-long training session in preparation to assist families and individuals prepare and file their 2007 tax returns during the three-day walk-in clinic hosted by the law school, Friday, Feb. 22, noon–8 p.m., Saturday, Feb. 23, 9 a.m.–6 p.m., and Sunday, Feb. 24, 1 p.m.–5 p.m.

The service is free and available to families and individuals with a household income of less than \$40,000 per year.
